Dear Parents and Guardians,

At our opening school mass this morning our first reading was from St Paul's letter to the Ephesians and Fr Dan talked with us about the need for three types of strength. Strength of muscle and bone, strength in our minds and strength of the heart. We were challenged to work on all our strengths in different ways every day, and especially our strength of heart through prayer and doing good things. This prayer of St Paul is a prayer for our school community:

Arriving on time each day

Beginning each day with a routine is a key element of learning. I want to emphasise how important the beginning of each day can be to set up the program for the day and begin the day in a positive frame of mind. In light of that can I emphasise that school begins at 8:45am. The school gates are opened at 8:15 and children are supervised in the yard from 8:30am. We look forward to seeing everyone at the morning briefing each day at 8:45am

Looking for volunteers at St Benedict's

We are looking for regular volunteers from the school and parish to support the learning of students. We already have one offer for Maths and that person will be working with the Seniors. It is beneficial for student learning if you are able to volunteer on a regular basis because this diminishes the disruption to their routine. We will be providing a training session for volunteers in the next few weeks before beginning with the students and all volunteers need a *Working With Children Check* (WWCC). The WWCC is free to those who are working in a voluntary capacity. If you are able to assist please email principal@sbburwood.catholic.edu.au and I will follow-up with the training time and we can negotiate regular times. We are looking for the following:

- <u>Literacy support in Juniors with reading</u>. Sitting in the classroom listening to students read using the books from the reading program that develop letter and word recognition and add to vocabulary acquisition as well as visualisation and observation techniques.
- <u>Weekly mini-canteen.</u> This is part of the financial literacy component of learning where students will be able to choose a small snack item or two and then pay for it. Items will be .50c or \$1 so as to streamline the process. It will need one person for about an hour from 1:10-2:10pm each Friday to do this but if there were several then we could sort out mini-roster.

- <u>Phonics development with Juniors and Middles.</u> This role is about supporting students with sounding out letters and groups of letters and so developing their ability to sound out words not previously seen or known.
- <u>Library technician</u>. This role is working in the library covering books and shelving returned books. While this role does not have direct interaction with students, it is extremely important support for student learning and for teachers.

C.S.E.F. (Camps, Sport and Excursions Fund)

Eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must: on the first day of Term one, or; on the first day of Term two; Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be the holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR

- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

Eligibility date

CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card successfully validating with Centrelink on either the first day of term one or term two.

Term one validation

If the parent/legal guardian's concession card successfully validates on the first day of term one, the application will be processed and the full annual payment will be made to the school from March, 2020.

Applications for Parents or legal guardians

Parents or legal guardians are required to complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with their child's school for processing. Please include a copy of the current concession card.

Application forms need to be completed and lodged with schools by **28th February 2020**, as payments are made from March.
