Dear Parents/ Guardians,

Thank you to all those who attended the parent information night. With the wind and torrential rain that day and evening we were greatly heartened by the turn out. Each classroom teacher spoke about the learning processes they will utilise in their classrooms over this year. It was also a great opportunity to sit in your child's classroom environment and see what they see.

As you know we experienced a lot of rain over Tuesday during the day and overnight. Too much rain for our drains to cope with and some rooms on the southern side of the building were flooded. One of the consequences of this was that our internet access was interrupted for about 36 hours and that affected some of our processes around setting up the 3-way conversations booking system (parent-student-teacher interviews) and of course the presentations that staff had organised for Tuesday evening. #### **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd**

Starting next Tuesday, the Year 3/4 students and teachers will be experiencing the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* in The Atrium at St Scholastica's. Beginning 10 March, the Year 1/2 students and teacher will join them. A permission note will be sent home about this and we will be looking for volunteers to accompany the students for this great experience. Here is some information from one of the catechists who will be working with teachers and children:

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a contemplative approach to religious formation for children ages 3-12 yrs. The Catechesis began in Rome in 1954 with Dr Sofia Cavalletti (a Hebrew and Scripture Scholar) and Gianna Gobbi (a Montessori Educator). Inspired by Montessori principles of education, CGS is deeply rooted in Liturgy and Scripture with Practical Life (activities relating to care and respect of the child and the world around them).

Each week, children are invited into a specially prepared environment called an Atrium. Through slow, thoughtful movements, and using sensorial rich materials, each work becomes a passage to prayer, or prayer itself. Through the work of their hands, the children encounter our Good Shepherd and discover a God who calls them each by name and loves them very much.

We have been blessed to be able to offer the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd to families in Melbourne since September 2005 and look forward to welcoming the children from St Benedict's in the coming weeks.

May our Lord continue to lead us together with the children. Shepherd's blessings,
