Dear Parents and Caregivers,

As we approach the official end of the remote learning phase of 2020 on Tuesday 9 June with the return of all the students in the Middles and Seniors classes, we should note it as one of the most unusual periods of history that we have lived through. It has been great to see students and staff supporting each other over the past 8 weeks of remote and at school learning. I know parents have been supporting their children at home too – and I hope the children have been doing small things to support parents. The many small and great actions we have undertaken to support and build our community have added up to an immense effort by St Benedict's and we should all be proud of that fact as we move to the next phase of learning in these unusual times with confidence in our ability to learn in difficult circumstances.

Feast of the Sacred Heart

The Feast of the Sacred Heart, on Friday 19 June, is a special day for Catholic communities when we focus on generosity and ways we can support others who may have a greater need than our own. In previous years we have attended mass and we hope to be able to do so again but await the next set of announcements from the Premier and Chief Medical Officer.

This year we will be making up small hampers to donate to St Vincent De Paul for distribution for families in great need. We are asking each class group to focus on one set of items to go into the hampers. We are asking each child to bring in one or two items to contribute to the whole St Benedict's contribution. We ask that you check the use by date on the item you send in as out of date items will go straight to garbage collection. Each class's allocated items are as follows:

- Juniors toiletries and bathroom items
- Middles breakfast items
- Seniors evening meal items / canned goods

Welcome back to Middles and Seniors 9 June at 8:45am

Learning at school begins for the Middles and Seniors at 8:45am on Tuesday 9 June. Gates open at 8:30am. School will conclude at 3:15pm each day. We will welcome back year levels with some lunchtime hot food. Staff will maintain high level food handling hygiene practices with respect to these events.

- 9 June **Welcome back to Middles and Seniors** (this will be for all students) *make your own pizza lunch*.
- 11 June Footy colours day wear your favourite football team's colours (includes AFL; Soccer; Gaelic football; Rugby) footy food lunch will be provided.

The following procedures to drop-off in the morning and pick-up in the afternoon will apply:

- Access to the school buildings is for students, staff, cleaners and contractors only
- Drop-off in the morning for students is via the driveway Gate 1
- Late-comers will arrive via Reception Gate 3
- Please, parents avoid being on the school grounds or in school buildings at any time
- Pick-up is via driveway Gate 1 please wait in your car or on the footpath along Central Avenue to collect your children



- If it is raining then we will have the children in the corridor behind Door B on sit-spots separated by 1.5 metres and will call them forward as you arrive for pick-up.
- All external gates will be locked at all times to prevent any other members of the wider Burwood community from accessing the school site access through the rear gate (Gate 6) will <u>not</u> be possible during Term 2 this will be reviewed for Term 3.

Strategies you can do to support us all staying healthy

We ask that you spend some time discussing with your child some strategies they can implement to ensure we all stay healthy. Some of these are very difficult because they are not what we want to do, but they are what we need to do:

- remind your child not to hug other children when returning to school
- if your child is unwell with any of the regular COVID19 symptoms stay home please
- discuss with them about social distancing
- try to maintain social distancing from any other people outside immediate family throughout the week and on weekends for the health of all

Religious Education

Gospel: John 3:16 - 18 Trinity Sunday

Gospel Reflection

The readings selected for Trinity Sunday provide an opportunity to reflect on the nature of God. Over



recent weeks, we have celebrated the Ascension and Pentecost – both of which reveal something about the nature of God through Jesus and the Spirit. Trinity Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate the unity of God whom we acknowledge as Father, Son and Spirit. Today's gospel reminds us that there is a seamless continuity between the different experiences of God. Although we sometimes regard the God of the Old Testament as judging and vengeful. Trinity Sunday reminds us that God is, was, and

always will be a God of love. The gospel reminds us that 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son.' Love is the characteristic of God that is experienced as Father, Son and Spirit. God loved the world into being and loved the people so much that God made a covenant relationship with them and repeatedly drew them back into that relationship when they strayed. God loved the world and the people so much that God became physically present through Jesus as yet another attempt to draw all people into an awareness of the loving relationship God desired for them. When Jesus could no longer remain a physical presence in the world, God's Spirit became more evident to continue the work of drawing people into that loving relationship with God.

Historical Context - We believe...


The teaching on the Trinity was not formally constructed until the 4th Century and was documented in the creed that emerged from the Council of Nicaea. The Creed that is said today in the Sunday liturgy is a version of that original Nicene Creed. The Nicene Creed spells out Christian beliefs about the nature of God, Jesus and the Spirit and was worded very carefully to negate a variety of heretical views that were held at the time. It is as much a statement about what we do not believe as it is a statement about what we do believe!

Scriptural context - Trinity

At no point in the New Testament is the term 'Trinity' used. That understanding of the nature of God came much later. However, there are a number of scriptural references that led to this theological understanding. The Annunciation, the baptism of Jesus and the great commissioning of the disciples to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are all examples of the three persons of God being recognised or active in the gospels. Today's second reading shows St Paul using the three experiences of God as a blessing of the people of Corinth.

Living the Gospel – Sign of the Cross

Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.
